



<u>S.V.P: SUDAN APPEAL</u>: Once again we are appealing to your generosity to support the work of the SVP in helping the suffering people of Sudan and South Sudan and so we provide a description of the situation. The original country of Sudan split into these separate countries in 2011 after several years of Muslim-inspired violence. The northern section, which was called Sudan, is home to Arabic-speaking Muslim communities while the south has no dominant culture but after independence a power struggle there led to civil war on tribal lines. The result of these conflicts is over 2 million deaths and 4 million displaced with 100,000 children orphaned or abandoned. Those refugees who fled to the North have not been granted refugee status so get no help from official agencies but suffer discrimination.

This is the context in which the SVP now operates. We work mainly in the refugee camps in both countries providing baby-feeding stations, pre-school meals, medical help and fresh drinking water. We can only fund this work due to your generosity. Accordingly, all the money you give us between this Sunday and the end of the year will go to the Sudan (unless you specify otherwise).

<u>Uganda Mission Fund- Fr Vincent</u>: Donations: £20, £50 and £100. Sincere thanks to the very generous donors. God bless you all.

News from Uganda: Last week Fr. Vincent went to the refugee camp to assess what can be done to improve the refugee children's education. The journey took 5 hours in very heavy rain and over rough ground and he managed to get though on the third attempt. Father took with him a blanket, food and water. He slept in his truck overnight and returned to the mission the next day. There is no furniture so children sit on the ground for lesson in the open air. The 'blackboard' is a large piece of wood with a chalk line down the middle and is shared by two classes. As a first response Fr. Vincent will buy some basic supplies of pens, pencils, books etc.

Also look out for the Fairtrade Popup stall at St Joseph's on Sunday 1st Dec, before Mass and afterwards until 1.00pm.
