We all need some statements like Peter's that give a rock and a meaning to life, It gives us a clue of where we belong at deeper levels. We all need statements that express our faith in God. For Peter it was his faith in Jesus, the Son of God. This would keep him going all of his life, even at times of unfaithfulness and danger. He could never forget that he had said, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God'. We need the rock that Peter found in Jesus. He was called because of his relationship with Jesus Christ, the one who calls forth our faith and love and gives our lives a huge meaning.

Jesus made clear that this was a particular grace from God which allowed Peter, from among all the apostles and disciples, to discern the true identity of Jesus. In this way, Peter announced his belief that Jesus was the promised Messiah who had come to deliver God's people from the bondage of sin. Jesus was much more than a prophet, and Peter was divinely inspired to acknowledge this truth.

Father, in St Peter You have shown us how You transform ordinary people and make them special. Make us like him: rock-like in our faith, courageous in our love and willing to risk all for Christ. Through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who is alive and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen
