Fourth Station ~ Jesus Meets his Mother

When Jesus and his mother meet they just look at each other, words cannot express how they feel. What he saw in his mother's eye must have hurt him more than the raw pain of his wounds.

Jesus, we remember the gaze that rested between you and your mother. In that moment of pain there was also a moment of deep and enduring love. Jesus, give us the courage to bring that love into the deepest recesses or our homes, to our children and to our spouses, to those places of fracture and disharmony in our circle of relationships.



Fifth Station - Simon helps Jesus Carry His Cross



Simon the Cyrene, a stranger in the city, did not know Jesus but that did not matter. What matters is that in this moment of need Simon was capable of lending his shoulders to one whose own had given out, of offering his strength to one who had nothing left, of taking on himself the cross which Jesus could no longer carry.

Lord, help us to grasp our opportunities to be a Simon in our world. In those times when we can help, let us have the generosity to do so.

Sixth Station - Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus

Jesus' journey is at times brutal. He has entered into the terrible experiences of rejection and injustice. He has been whipped and beaten. His face shows the signs of his solidarity with all who have ever suffered injustice and vile, abusive treatment. He encounters a compassionate, loving disciple who wipes the blood from his face. On her veil she discovers the image of his face, his gift to her and for us to contemplate forever.



Let us remember our family members and friends who were there with us, to comfort us during the most painful times of our life. Let us pray for them, for all the times they comforted us and brought back faith to our lives. **Minsteracres Retreat Centre . . . English Passionist Priest on course to be declared a Saint ∼ Pope Francis has approved the heroic virtues of Ignatius of Saint Paul who will now have the title Venerable. Servant of God Ignatius of Saint Paul, an English Passionist priest, was born George Spencer on 21st December 1799 in London, a son of the 2nd Earl Spencer. He is a relative of Diana, Princess of Wales, as well as the great uncle of Second World War Prime Minister Winston Churchill. The Spencer family, mostly members of the Church of England, were the fifth wealthiest family in England at the time. Father Spencer converted to Roman Catholicism in 1830, in Rome, at the age of 31, scandalising some in the Victorian society. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1832 and entered the Passionist Order in 1847. The authorisation of this decree by Pope Francis was one of eight presented to him by the Vatican Congregation for the Causes of Saints on Saturday 20th February 2021.

In order to be canonised and declared a saint, two miracles must be attributed to Ignatius of Saint Paul. The first will see him beatified and declared 'Blessed'. A second miracle will pave the way to sainthood. To read more visit the website: www.cbcew.org.uk and then select 'News'
