Reflection - Holy Trinity Sunday

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Gospel is famously known as the "Great Commission," the time when Christ authorised his Apostles to "make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" as he ascended to heaven. This is likely the first time that they heard Jesus mention the words Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in one sentence.

It is by grace that this feast is in the month of May, the month of worldwide devotion to Mary. It is also by divine providence that our parish is named "Our Lady of Walsingham" for we are a people who know how to give sincere love and devotion to our Blessed Mother. The apparition of Mary in Walsingham resonates within us because it reminds us of the Annunciation, that moment when mankind received two great gifts: the gift of a Saviour born into our world, and the gift of Mary becoming a mother. A closer look at the Annunciation reveals to us that before the Apostles heard the names of the Trinity mentioned in one sentence, it was Mary who heard them first. For after enquiring how she would conceive the Son of God, the angel said to Mary, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. (Lk. 1:35)" Thus, when Mary gave her fiat, she did not only say yes to be the mother of God's Son, but she was also drawn into the familial love of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

We are also recipients of this, because through our baptism, we are incorporated into the circle of the Trinitarian love. God's love is overflowing and is the kind of love that yearns to be shared. Like Mary and the disciples, we are also invited to this "co-mission" of spreading God's love to our families, friends, and the people at the peripheries of our community who need love most. It is only when we give love and most especially when we share our humanity to others that our love for our Triune God and His love for us come into perfection.

Holy Trinity Readings - Year B

First Reading

Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt? 'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you forever.'

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 32(33):4-6,9,18-20,22

1. For the word of the Lord is faithful and all his works to be trusted. The Lord loves justice and right and fills the earth with his love.

3. The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Gospel Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'
