The soud of God's presence within us was fir

The seed of God's presence within us was first planted at our baptism. Our task is to look after it so that it can work powerfully within us, making a difference in our own lives and through us, in the lives of others. God keeps us alert to opportunities and helps us to recognise our role in bringing his Kingdom near through the love we show, the care we display and the seeds we sow by the service we offer to others.

This Sunday is a Day of Prayer for Human Life . . . The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. This year the theme is `*The Lord is my Shepherd – Compassion and Hope at the End of Life.*' A debate on end-of-life issues has been in the headlines in recent months with calls for assisted suicide being expressed, a view that opposes the Catholic view that life is a gift and that we are called to care for others at the end of their lives. The elderly are revered in the Bible, Elizabeth and Zechariah bore John the Baptist in old age. Whether long or short, each stage has its own beauty and worth. When the vulnerable, the sick, the disabled and the dying are discarded or not properly cared for, it undermines the wisdom and compassion that we can learn from one another and it violates our relationship with God. **There will be a second collection** at Mass this weekend which helps to fund organisations which support the dignity of human life and the Church's teaching.

We pray for those who are afraid, suffering or in despair that they may come to feel the presence of the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, ever near them ready to lead them out of their darkness and into the light of hope. We pray for those who care for the sick and dying, and for those who work in palliative care that modelling themselves on Christ the Good Samaritan who binds up all our wounds, they may bring true compassion and hope so that no one feels abandoned, useless or a burden. Amen.
